



IN YOU WE TRUST RESIDENCIES

There are two small single bedrooms, so not more than two artists can stay at any one time. Residencies are for periods of no less than a week and generally no more than three weeks. Longer stays may however be negotiable in off-peak periods. Be warned - the tower is in the centre of the town, and can be noisy at nights.

Please note that the building is NOT suitable for disabled residents. It is an historic building. The stairs are narrow and steep enough for able-bodied visitors, but treat them with respect and they will not twist your ankle.

Central heating is included but if you want to use the coal fire in the living room provide your own coal or logs.

In summer you are expected to cut the grass if it is getting long, and to keep the weeds down on the path. You are welcome to do some gardening.

You are allotted one page of the Tower Log Book to record events and ideas. You must sign and date the page (please follow in sequence from the last artist), but otherwise may put as many or as few words pictures or other notes on it as you wish.

You should leave a piece of work behind you to become part of the Tower's collection. It must be no bigger than and no smaller than. Although the artworks will belong in the Tower and should be site-specific, please respect other artists' work and also the Tower itself. We would prefer work to be removable in order to preserve the flexibility of the space, but permanent installations will normally be acceptable as long as they do not damage or impede the enjoyment of the building itself and existing artworks. If you prefer, the work may take the form of a framed picture, a piece of writing or music, a tape or record of an installation. You will be responsible for documenting your own work - either by leaving the physical piece of work, or if it is less tangible by providing slides (not more than ten), a video, sketches or writing. Alternatively you must agree to contribute a piece of work to the tower's annual summer exhibition. A commission of 10% will be charged on any sales made at the annual show. Provide a note on your work for inclusion in any future catalogue.

We have a computer in the Tower. As there is no phone line to the Tower there is no internet connection.

Ensure that your own insurance covers any valuables you bring to the Tower, as we cannot be responsible for them. The Trustees reserve right of access at any time, and will terminate the residency if it is being abused.

Leave everything clean and tidy when you leave. Make sure you have filled in your page in the Log Book.

You must respect the neighbours and people in the village. It is their tower, and they take a proprietorial interest in our activities.
